Past President and Conference Update

The plans for the WSRT 2016 Annual Conference being held in Cody, Wyoming this year continue to move forward. The West Park Hospital in Cody has recently completed construction on their Baker Education & Conference Center and have made it available for our use Sept 16th – 17th.

To add a little Spirit of the West, arrangements have been made with the Cody Cowboy Village for lodging. Several options have been offered: Rooms with a single King bed will run from \$155 to \$165 per night – 14 available, Rooms with 2 Queen beds run from \$159 to \$169 per night – 10 available, and with our Colleges in mind there are a handful of suites available that include 3 Queen beds accommodating 6 students per suite starting at \$179 per night.

With the lodging there are a few things to keep in mind. First of all, the conference falls in the peak of the tour bus season for Cody and the Park region. This means that lodging becomes a premium as time gets closer to the conference dates. The options above are to assist some with the time buffering as these rates are locked in until July 31; at that time we lose reservation status and pricing on all remaining rooms. They are first come first serve so the first to make reservations will get the best pricing. We strongly encourage you act quickly whether you book your own rooms or take advantage of the Cowboy Village offer. If you choose to make your own arrangements I will offer the same sage advice that I was given that rates increase significantly each week that passes and availability sharply decreases.

To take advantage of the Cody Cowboy Village rooms you can contact Petra by **phone (307) 587-7555 or via email ccv@tctwest.net**. Mention that you are affiliated with the “Wyoming Society of Radiologic Technologists” to get the discounted pricing. One last note, we are currently in the middle of their off season so Petra isn’t always available on site, so if you call and she doesn’t answer leave a message describing your reservation request and she will return your call as soon as she returns to the office, the same goes for email. The pricing is set so this delay will not affect your room rate.

We certainly are looking forward to the upcoming conference and hope as many as possible are able to join us.

LCCC Unveils New Computed Tomography Registry Review Course Tuition Coverage Available!

In preparation for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) structured education eligibility requirements that went into effect 1/1/16 for all applicants in post-primary disciplines, Laramie County Community College (LCCC) is pleased to announce the approval and launching of a new course: RDTK 2990* - COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (CT) REGISTRY PREPARATION FOR TECHNOLOGISTS. We had 10 students enroll in this course's "maiden voyage" in Fall 2015, and we know of at least two students who have gone on to successfully take and pass their CT Registry as a result!

*After Spring 2016, the course number will be RDTK 2950

If you would like to take advantage of this new course opportunity, we will be offering this online 3 credit hour class again in the Spring 2016 semester. It is offered in an eight-week format, starting March 21, 2016 and ending on May 13, 2016. To enroll: if you have not been a student at LCCC or have not been enrolled in an LCCC course for a while, you may need to go through the admission process and/or be readmitted first so that you can register for the class. The admission process is free, but please allow up to 48 hours from the time you apply to the time that you may be allowed to register. Once you have been admitted to LCCC, you will be given an EaglesEye account and then you are able to register online.

And...if you are still sitting on the fence...because RDTK 2990/RDTK 2950 is considered a work-ready course, ALL of the tuition for this course is eligible to be covered by an ACT Now! Federal grant—including both in-state, WUE, and out-of-state tuition! We have space for 15 students and we have a few slots filled already, so if you are planning on taking the CT registry any-time soon, consider signing up. Or if you know of someone planning on taking the CT exam, please feel free to share this information with them.

The board can be notified by email, written letter or phone.





The Board sends renewal notices no later than thirty (30) days prior to the license expiration date, so it is important that you update the Board office with your correct contact information. **FAILURE TO RECEIVE NOTICE FOR RENEWAL OF LICENSE FROM THE BOARD DOES NOT EXCUSE A LICENSEE FROM THE REQUIREMENT FOR RENEWAL!**
